II. Summary of Amendments Contained in Message:

House Amendment 1 removes section 34 of the bill which removed a reference to the Department of Health's strategic plan.

House Amendment 2 amends section 44 of the bill, leaving chapter 9J-5 of the Florida Administrative Code, Minimum Criteria for Review of Local Government Comprehensive Plans and Plan Amendments, subject to chapter 120, F.S., requirements.

House Amendment 3 removes section 66 of the bill which repealed the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development's rulemaking ability under section 288.108, Florida Statutes.

House Amendment 4 removes section 105 of the bill which deleted the requirement under section 394.9082 (9), Florida Statutes, that the Department of Children and Family Services present biannual reports on the status of its contracts with behavioral health management entities to the Legislature.

House Amendment 5 removes section 163 of the bill which deleted the requirement under section 768.295(6), Florida Statutes, that the Attorney General report any instances of a governmental entity's participation in a SLAPP suit.

House Amendment 6 removes section 178 of the bill which deleted the requirement that the Commissioner of Education annually evaluate charter technical career centers and public technical centers.

House Amendment 7 removes section 180 of the bill which deleted the requirement under section 1003.61, Florida Statutes, that each State University division of sponsored research annually submit a report of activities and an estimated budget to the Legislature.

House Amendment 8 removes sections 182 and 183 of the bill, which deleted provisions under section 1004.95, Florida Statutes, granting the Commissioner of Education and the State Board of Education the power to create and implement guidelines for, and evaluation criteria of the adult literacy program.
